The development of your new super surgery at Mount Vernon Hospital is now well underway. If you pass by Gate A of the entrance to the hospital you will be able to see at first hand how ambitious this project is. The centre is surrounded by lush greenery, in close proximity to new services being developed in the hospital, making this the perfect site for you to receive high quality clinical care. Our task is how to use our move to the new site to provide the best medical care for you and your family.

Our New Super GP Centre

We are therefore spending much effort to ensure that the waiting room, reception area and consulting rooms will be calm, welcoming and appealing.

Our plans include:

- Separate interview room for improved patient confidentiality.
- New telephone system to manage large volume of calls more effectively.
- ▶ 15 consulting rooms so that our doctors and nurses have their own work space for a change!
- A minor surgery suite so Dr Kant can continue his valued service and reduce hospital referrals.
- Accommodation for health visitors and district nurses to work on site.
- Meeting rooms for patient groups to meet.

Future plans include:

- Commuter clinics.
- More telephone clinics for direct advice from doctors and nurses.
- Patient group education where we aim to empower you to manage your own illness.
- New health care assistants to complement our nursing team.
- Extension of Dr Kant's community cardiology clinics for our own patients and other Hillingdon residents.
- Extension of our diabetes service and insulin management by our excellent diabetes team, to reduce the need for our patients to attend hospital.
- Further development of our own range of diabetes booklets and our award

winning 'Essential tests and checks' booklets.

- Expansion of medical student and junior doctor education programme.
- Continued GP and nurse services from the Northwood Health Centre site, which will operate as a branch surgery.

These are tremendously exciting times for us with so much opportunity to fulfil our long held dreams of innovative and excellent patient care and education, in our own purpose built centre. We look forward to sharing all of this with you.

Build Update

s soon as the land purchase was completed on 12th May, tree surgeons moved onto the site to cut back the undergrowth. Asbestos was safely removed from the derelict nurses home before it was demolished. This allowed pile boring to start, a total of 89 piles were cast, some to a depth of 15 metres. Concrete ground beams followed with foundation brickwork to damp proof course. It was fascinating to see how quickly a specialist team laid the beam and block ground floor, all done in 5 days. And now, with both internal and external ground floor walls nearing completion, we'll see the first floor laid this month. Much of our attention is now focused on interior design, furniture and equipment. The doctors and nurses have already chosen colour schemes for their consulting and treatment rooms from a prepared range of co-ordinated options. It's all very exciting! Max Black
