
Flu Jabs

Good News: Extra Appointments Available for our Patients

Extended Hours Hub

There are three hubs which are spread across Hillingdon Borough - Eastcote Health Centre, Uxbridge Health Centre and HESA centre. The Hubs are a service where we can provide you with a wider range of appointments (including evenings and weekends).

You will need to consent to the service seeing your medical records. This is so they can use your medical history to aid their diagnosis and treatment.

This is an excellent service which is in place to help all local GP practices with the huge demand on daily appointments, Mountwood patients will be triaged to these extra services. Weekend appointments are also available at the Hub for nurses appointments, these are great for anyone who is unable to attend the practice during their working week. Please ask our friendly reception team for further details.

Cryotherapy

Cryotherapy, using freezing to remove warts, is no longer offered at the Surgery. Please speak to your local pharmacy for advice regarding alternative treatments which are equally effective.

Cervical Screening

Please don't forget to book your appointment for a smear test.

Cervical screening is offered to all women aged 25 to 49 every three years and for women aged 50 to 64 every five years.
